





Section 5: COVID-19 Monitoring & Communication

Status Green 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Rate of uncontrolled COVID-19 infection is low-Government permits essential services, including schools, to remain open	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Campus is open to all students-No known cases of COVID-19 amongst students, families, or staff at MCS-Protocols for health and safety are being observed by students, families, and staff-Students remain in classroom cohorts
Status Yellow 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Rate of uncontrolled COVID-19 infection is rising with heightened level of concern-Government permits essential services, including schools, to remain open-Some additional or potential mandates on citizens/businesses being considered by State, County, or Federal governmental bodies	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Campus is open to all students-<u>Possible case/s of COVID-19 amongst students, families, or staff, yet to be confirmed</u>-Protocols for health and safety are being observed by students, families, and staff-All students allowed to attend in-person instruction remain in classroom cohorts
Status Orange 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Rate of uncontrolled COVID-19 infection continues to grow-Hawaii State Government issues new recommendations for essential services including schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Some parts of the campus are closed due to diagnosis of or exposure to COVID-19 by a student, staff member, or parent, or by state government mandate.-Some classroom cohorts continue learning on campus.-All students allowed to attend in-person instruction remain in classroom cohorts-Protocols for health and safety are being observed by students, families, and staff
